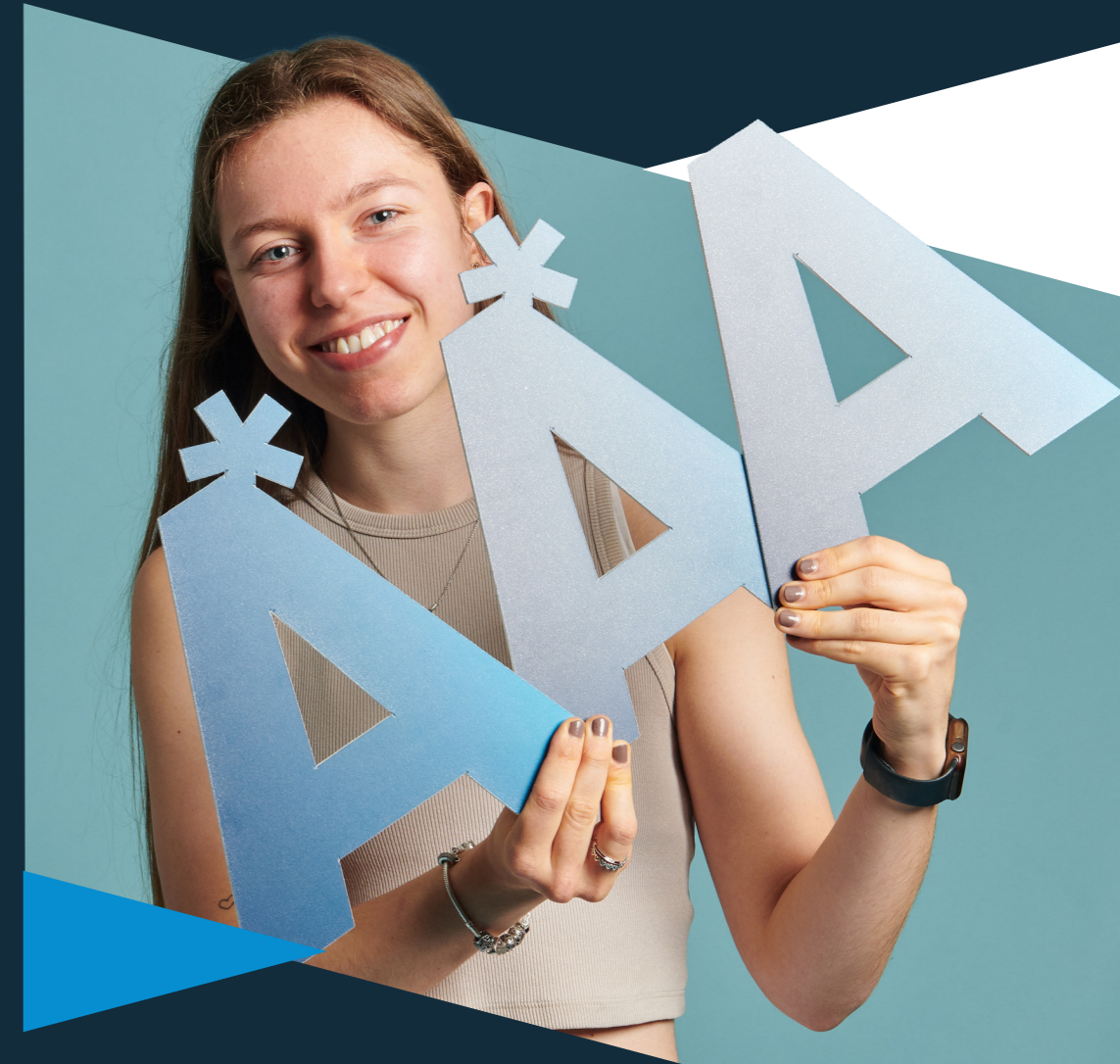
# GOALS 2024 - 27
